# **Head Lice in Schools**



Head lice and nits commonly occur in students of elementary school age. While RKT staff will be vigilant in watching for new cases, please do your part to prevent the spread of this communicable condition by checking your child(ren) on a regular basis.

When a child is found to have head lice, they may remain at school. There is no medical reason for excluding a child with nits or live lice from school. While there is nothing to be embarrassed about, please note that our staff handle this situation sensitively when it arises in order to maintain the dignity and privacy of our students. We do inform parents/caregivers if a child is suspected of having head lice so they can receive treatment. Please note, that while head lice infestations are common, they are not dangerous, nor do they indicate uncleanliness or spread disease.

#### Volunteers make a difference!

HRCE values the many roles that volunteers play in our schools.

Parents, guardians, family members and community members who give of their time provide students with enriched learning experiences. As a volunteer, you will also discover the many rewards of helping students achieve their personal best.

Volunteers perform many different tasks in our schools. Some of the more common experiences include chaperoning field trips or special events.

### **Student safety is paramount**

We recognize our responsibility to ensure that all students attending our schools are protected by taking reasonable precautions to screen volunteers who may be working with students without direct supervision of staff. In accordance with Nova Scotia's Provincial **Volunteer Background Check Policy**, prior to volunteering with the Halifax Regional Centre for Education, all volunteers will provide:

A completed Child Abuse Register search, which can be found **here** 

A certified and true copy of a Criminal Records Check with Vulnerable Sector Check available **here**, from your local Police or RCMP detachment or through online organizations endorsed by Nova Scotia law enforcement agencies.

Please note: the Child Abuse Register Search and Criminal Records Check must be issued in the three months preceding volunteering and updated every three years.





#### \*New Provincial School Lunch Program

Families across Nova Scotia will soon be able to order school lunches that are affordable, nutritious and delicious. Lunches at RKT will start on October 28, with ordering opening two weeks before the first lunches are served.

Families will be able to choose between two lunch options every school day, with at least one vegetarian (no meat) lunch offered each day. In total, there will be 40 menu options that rotate weekly when the program starts in October.

Each meal provides balanced nutrition and meets the standards outlined in Canada's Food Guide and the Nova Scotia School Food and Nutrition Policy. The menu offers options that celebrate the diversity of Nova Scotian students, such as Acadian chicken fricot, murgh makhani (butter chicken), corn chowder with l'uskinikn (a traditional Mi'kmaw biscuit) and moujadara (a baked rice dish with lentils and caramelized onions). Popular student-approved favourites like macaroni and cheese and pizza are also on the menu.

Other school food programs, including the free breakfast program and snack programs will continue as usual.
